



- The Georgetown Township Ordinance prohibits the burning of leaves at any time of year.
- If you wish to do a “write-in” vote, the name you wish to write in must have filed an “Affidavit of Identity” with the Township in order for the vote to be counted.
- You can dispose of unused personal medications at the Ottawa County Health department located at 3100 Port Sheldon Road (669-0040) on Monday, Wednesday, or Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Please remove pills from the pill bottles and place them in a plastic bag.
- The Township no longer sells dog licenses. Ottawa County dog licenses can be purchased or renewed online at <http://www.miottawa.org/DogLicense/> or by mail ([you can print the form here](#)). Regular (before March 1) male/female licenses are \$15, regular spay/neuter licenses are \$6 and regular puppy licenses are \$6. Delinquent (on or after March 1) male/female licenses are \$30 and delinquent spay/neuter licenses are \$12. All dogs four (4) months old and older must have a current Ottawa County dog license. State statute requires that new dogs must have a license within 30 days.
- Garage Sale signs may not be located within a public right-of-way or on any utility pole. The person responsible for placing the sign must provide

their address on the sign and the date for the first day the sign is displayed. The sign may be displayed for a maximum period of seven (7) days.

- Georgetown Township has 12,000,000 gallons of water in storage, plus 7,604,771 gallons in underground pipes, totaling 19,604,771 gallons of water for Georgetown Township. This is equal to 163,503,790 pounds or 81,752 tons of water in storage!!
- Taxable value is used to calculate property tax bills. The taxable value on a property can only change each year by the rate of inflation (Consumer Price Index) or 5%, whichever is less. This rate, however, does not apply to properties that have sold in the previous year.
- In 2009, Georgetown Township had over 350 usable home sales for the annual residential sales study. The result was an average decrease of 5%.
- Section 10-220 of the Township Ordinance states that the occupant or owner of every lot or premises adjoining any street shall clear snow from sidewalks within 24 hours of cessation of the snowfall.
- In May 2009, only 16.62% of voters in Georgetown Township came out to vote in the school election. In comparison, the general election held in November 2008 had a voter turnout of 88.08%.
- In Williams, Arizona residents pay \$42.50 per 1000 gallons of water. In Georgetown Township residents pay only \$1.75 per 1000 gallons of water.
- Georgetown Township has 12,000,000 gallons of water in storage at any given time.

- There are 1,242 townships in the State of Michigan. They range in population of 17 persons to 98,000. Over ½ of Michigan's population lives in townships. Georgetown Township is the tenth largest township in the state.
- The Georgetown Fire Department has (3) full time personnel (fire chief, fire inspector and firefighter). The fire department operates out of (3) fire stations and (49) paid on call firefighters. At the current time our Insurance Services Offices (ISO) rating is five (5).
- The property tax rate for the City of Grandville is almost four times (4x) higher than Georgetown Township's. The property tax rate for the City of Wyoming is four and one half times (4^{1/2}x) higher, and the City of Hudsonville is five times (5x) higher than Georgetown Township's.
- All of the money received from the summer tax collection goes to the county and schools; none is allocated to Georgetown Township
- Georgetown Township is the largest municipality in Ottawa County
- Georgetown Township is 4th largest unit of government in West Michigan behind the Cities of Grand Rapids, Wyoming, and Kentwood
