Fire Investigation and Follow Up

- Wrote a follow up letter to Van Manen Petroleum reference to a fuel leak on Pump #4 at their Pacific Pride facility located at 2353 Wilshire. We inquired about exactly what happens when someone activates the emergency shutdown button.
- Met with PCI Inspectors, Chief Hamming, Dick Kennedy, and Mr. Sherwin Heyboer's maintenance supervisor at 171 Baldwin, Apartment "E" on the morning of June 26. This was a follow up investigation of the ceiling collapse in Apartment "E" on the night of June 23.

Other

- Had monthly progress meeting with Chief Hamming and F. F. Matt DeWitt.
- Put together fire prevention material for F. F. Phil Koster who was giving a talk and tour to 12 children at Station 1.
- Reviewed plans for an outbuilding at 1101 Cypress, Cottonwood CRC.
- Met with Lt. Ryan Tibbets at Station 1 to review upcoming drivers training and pump training for the department.
- F. F. Matt DeWitt and I brought a fire engine to the Early Childhood Center (the old Maplewood Elementary School) to talk to the children about our jobs and all the tools on the engine that we use to perform our job. This was for their "Career Week". We talked to 42 children and 6 teachers.
- Checked out the road closure at 40th Ave. and the railroad crossing. CSX advised that they would have this closed for approximately 4 weeks.
- Picked up the Touch-N-Trac readers from Station 1 and brought them up to Station 3 for our training session with the company tech. rep.
- Met with Chris Barnes, from O.A.K. Construction Co., reference fire hydrant locations at the new Chapel Pointe Church site on Baldwin Street.
- Assist Lt. Ryan Tibbets and F. F. Matt DeWitt with setting up the drivers training course at Mars Hill.
- Redo and distribute updated Knox Box listings to the stations.
- Procter the fire engine pumping evolutions for the afternoon training of our fire fighters.
- Had conversation with Fire Pros in reference to the Target store updating their commercial cooking hood fire suppression system.
- Picked up Engine 825 from Action Collision after having the drivers door window repaired.
- Worked with Dave Fontaine from Central Dispatch on the updates for our GEO files.

- Met with Craig Zimmerman from Vanguard Fire & Security at Station 3 in reference to McDonald's restaurant on Baldwin Street updating their commercial cooking hood fire suppression system.
- Plan Review – 2187 Port Sheldon Road, drive-in financial establishment for the LaMacchia Group, LLC, 309 North Water Street, Milwaukee, WI.
- Plan Review – Preliminary Plat of Summerset West.
- Picked up Engine 826 from HME and return it to Station 3.
- Mailed out pre-inspection letters to local businesses.
- Took delivery of new fire hose at Station 1 from JDS.
- F. F. Matt DeWitt and I attended Byron Center Banks customer appreciation day. We displayed fire safety literature and talked to the children and their parents about fire safety and showed them around Engine 824.
- Checked out the road closure of Cottonwood Drive and Chicago Drive. CSX will have the crossing torn out for one week.

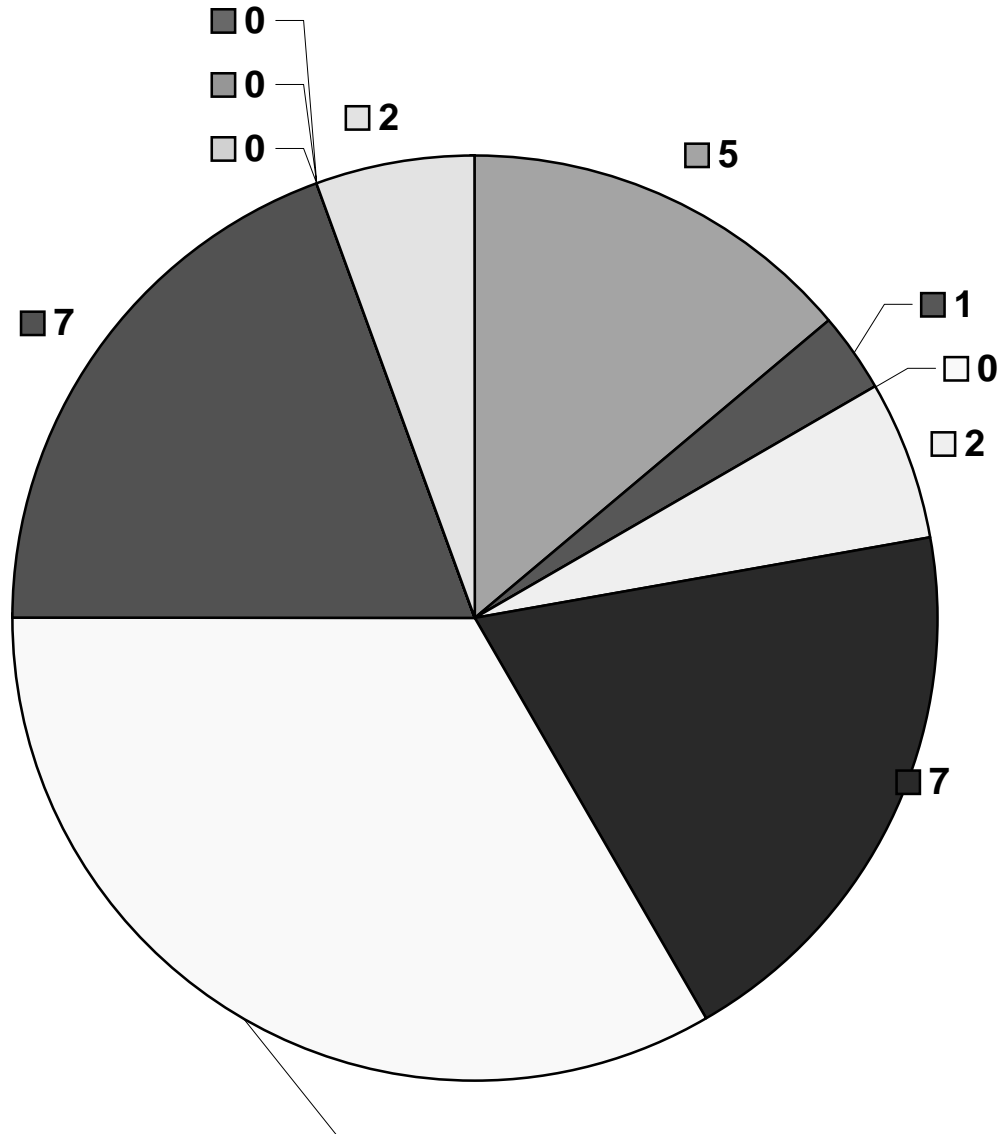
June 2006
